Parents, students, teachers, staff and partners, let's celebrate the start of a new school year as a community! Don't miss this fun school-wide event taking place on our PVES campus.

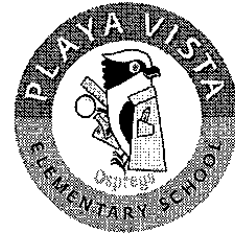
We'll celebrate together with the In-N-Out truck, Artsy Kids, Plum Print, Music, and a ton of outdoor games.

NASA also provided us with approved viewing glasses, one for every student in the school!

Dear Parent/Guardian:

On Monday, August 21, 2017, for the first time since 1918, a solar eclipse will be visible on a path across the United States. In Los Angeles, we will experience a partial eclipse from approximately 9:00 a.m. until noon.


Schools are being directed to take precautionary steps and modify their schedules as needed to ensure student safety during this special event. Please be aware that looking directly at the sun is unsafe and can cause permanent eye damage or other unknown effects. The only way to look safely at the sun – uneclipsed or partially eclipsed – is through special-purpose solar filters, such as “eclipse eyewear.” According to NASA, homemade filters or ordinary sunglasses, even those with very dark lenses, are not safe for looking at the sun. We also encourage you to speak with your child about the risks of looking directly at the sun.

The solar eclipse provides a rare, educational opportunity, and we are providing instructional resources so that students can safely experience the solar eclipse at their school. Some schools have planned outdoor viewing events where students and staff will utilize special eyewear that meets NASA-approved specifications. Participation in these events will require a signed permission slip.
